

METHODS is a 3-year project that started on the 15th October, 2015 and is co-funded by the Erasmus+ programmed of the European Union. It is coordinated by The University of Jordan (UJ) with 14 partners from Jordan, Palestine and European countries.

The project aims at improving the quality of teaching and learning at the partner universities with cooperation of EU-experience through incorporating technological tools in consistence with pedagogical best practices and by building the capacity of the universities to evaluate, develop and design e-curricula.

IETHODS helps students to engage with the material, participate in the class, and collaborate with each other. The students are no longer listen and memorize only; instead, they are demonstrate a process, analyze an argument, or apply a concept to a real-world situation.



Much curriculum upgrade effort on campus has been lately focused on integrating a practical side along with the theoretical side in the course plans. The practice will help learners develop the necessary skills to translate the acquired knowledge into tangible course products.

The Center for Excellence at ANNU delivered a 3-hour training workshop to train ANNU academic staff on designing formative and summative assessment activities to measure and evaluate those skills and on using tools that are designed to measure learner performance along with product quality.

The main objectives for this workshop were 1) Present, discuss and compare assessment approaches; 2) Align assessment schemes with course ILOs; 3) train faculty members on using new assessment methods like portfolios, project evaluation schemes, problem solving evaluation rubrics, presentation rubrics among others; 4) Provide learners with the opportunity to reflect on assessment methods for the proposed Innovation course.

The meeting gathered representatives from different project partners including Jordan, Palestine, Denmark, United Kingdom, and Germany.


The meeting focused on



Monitoring visit for METHODS at Birzeit University





The station will be utilized to train faculty members on how to use technology in education and apply modern educational methodologies.








METHODS in Palestinian Press

METHODS supports students to conduct their graduation projects and dissertations

Students from Aalborg university in Copenhagen utilized METHODS project to investigate many issues in Education in Jordan and Palestine and conduct their thesis. The results are being published in conferences and scientific Journals. The themes for their research include the following areas:




METHODS Final Conference
